

All Non-U.S. Citizens Must Read

The Arms Export Control Act gives the President of the United States the authority to control the export and import of defense articles with wide discretion in the definition of “defense articles”. These “defense articles” are enumerated in what is known as the Munitions List. The intention of this act was to control the flow of military hardware and technology to “unfriendly” states during the cold war. This act originally, and in practice for many years, was considered to apply only to U.S. Government contractors.

The President has delegated this responsibility to the United States Department of State (D.O.S.). For years the D.O.S. and industry routinely ignored the finer points of these regulations. Then September 11, happened and the D.O.S. began to enforce these regulations sporadically and inconsistently.

Unfortunately, Olive Security Training Center (formerly know as Tactical Explosive Entry School, Inc.) has been caught up in this attempt to suddenly apply these regulations before there are administrative procedures in place to effectively deal with companies attempting compliance.

This is important to you as a potential student of the Olive Security Training Center because certain classes we teach involve the transfer of technical data on the use of items on the munitions list. Therefore, that class would be regulated by the D.O.S.

So, at the present time, to attend the following classes we must obtain approval from the D.O.S. for all non-U.S. citizens.

- **Hostage Rescue**
- **School Incident**
- **CQB Safety Officer**
- **Tactical Pistol**
- **Tactical Carbine**
- **Counter- Terrorism**
- **High Risk Environment Personal Security Detail**
- **Dignitary/ Witness Protection**
- **Total Tactics**
- **Sniper/Observer**

If you wish to attend one of the above classes you must:

Notify our office at least 20 weeks in advance of commencement of course of your intention to attend and provide the following documentation:

1. A detailed resume or Curriculum Vitae
2. Provide a letter from employer explaining need for training
3. Completed OSTC application for training
4. Completed OSTC foreign application for training

At this time, the following courses do not need D.O.S. approval:

- **Explosive Handlers**
- **Explosive Entry**
- **Advanced Explosive Entry**
- **Mechanical Breaching**
- **Command and Control**
